

CONFLICT MINERALS REPORT

Supplier: NEW DIMENSIONS Precision Machining

PART I – DEFINITIONS

Adjoining Countries: “Adjoining Countries” of the DRC are Angola, the Republic of Congo, the Central African Republic, South Sudan, Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi, Tanzania, and Zambia.

Buyer: Applied Industrial Technologies, Inc. and its subsidiaries.

Conflict Minerals: defined by the Dodd-Frank Act and its implementing regulations, including Section 13(p) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (the “Rule”). At this time, “Conflict Minerals” means **gold, tantalum, tin, and tungsten.**


